## Homework, assignments, etc.

- Homework: For most weeks, there will be a written homework. Due date will be specified when the homework is handed out, but generally they will be due Wednesday before class.
- Assignments: In addition to the weekly homework, there will be 5 programming-oriented assignments where we will be building an IR system from the ground up. These will generally be due every other Friday.
- Final project: For the last month of class, you will be working on a final project. Details will follow soon, but for those that took AI, it will have a similar format.

• Late policy: Except under extenuating circumstances, I will not accept late homework or assignments.

## Exams and quizzes

Tentatively, there will be two exams, one at mid-point and one during our final exam time slot. Currently, I do not plan on having quizzes, however, I reserve the right to change this policy if I feel that people aren't keeping up with the material and/or attending class regularly.
